Although not on the list of 'those consulted' (Annex F of the Consultation Document), I have been asked to respond on behalf of East Coast Main Line Company ('East Coast') who, as I am sure you are aware, took over operations from the previous franchisee (National Express East Coast) in December of last year. For information, NXEC are included in the list of those consulted and I would be grateful if you could amend your records and include East Coast in any future consultations.

In general terms, East Coast (EC) has no objection to the proposals to introduce The Railways and Guided Transport (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations 2010. In response to the specific questions contained in Annex A, we make the following comments:

Q1: We agree that no changes should be made to the current exclusions from ROGS.

Q2: We are not aware of any circumstances in which vehicles registered and maintained according to the laws of a non-EU Member State enter Great Britain.
