Prosecution



Summary

On 20th December 2018 two Network Rail employees were called to attend Godinton substation to respond to a possible circuit breaker fault.

In order to remedy the fault, the employees sought to remove a fuse within the circuit breaker, which was located inside the substation. When changing the fuse, there was a large explosion. One employee was knocked back and another set on fire, suffering third degree and mixed depth burns to 17% of his body. The substation was destroyed by the fire.

The immediate cause of the incident was Network Rail's failure, over a significant period of time, to prevent water from leaking into the substation building and a failure to maintain the dehumidifiers installed inside. The conditions in the substation were unsafe and led to an electrical arc and a fire whilst Network Rail's employees were working on a circuit breaker within the substation.
