Approval of the 90th supplemental agreement to the track access contract between Network Rail Infrastructure Limited (Network Rail) and Arriva Rail London Limited (trading as 'London Overground') dated 9 November 2007

We have today approved the above supplemental agreement submitted to us formally on 28 June 2024 under section 22 of the Railways Act 1993 (the Act). This follows an earlier informal submission of a draft agreement for our consideration. This letter explains the reasons for our decision.

Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to convert two existing late-night weekend Empty Coaching Stock (ECS) movements between Watford Junction and Willesden Junction into passenger services. This will extend the hours of service at some stations along the Watford lines and is intended improve the overall service level. The changes are proposed to commence on the Principal Change Date in December 2024 and will expire at the expiry date or earlier termination of London Overground's track access contract.

Industry consultation

Network Rail undertook the usual industry consultation between 16 May and 17 June. Three responses were received: 'no objection' comments from Great Western Railways and Transport Focus, and a response in support from London TravelWatch.

ORR review

Our review of the application raised no operational, performance or economic concerns. We identified some minor drafting issues, which were resolved prior to the agreement being formally submitted.

Our duties under section 4 of the Act and our decision

We have concluded that approval of this supplemental agreement strikes the appropriate balance in discharging our statutory duties under section 4 of the Act; in particular, those relating to protecting the interests of users of railway services (section 4(1)(a)), promoting the use of the railway network for the carriage of passengers (section 4(1)(b)) and enabling persons providing railway services to plan their businesses with a reasonable degree of assurance (section 4(1)(g)).

Conformed copy of the track access agreement

Under clause 18.2.4 of the track access contract, Network Rail is required to produce a conformed copy, within 28 days of any amendment being made, and send copies to ORR and the Train Operator. Please send the conformed copy to me at ORR.
