PROSECUTION

Summary

On the 26th May 2011, during the evening rush hour peak, approximately 800 passengers were trapped on a broken down train for approximately three hours at Dock Junction between St Pancras International and Kentish Town stations following a power failure.

The air conditioning and communication systems on the train failed leading to a lack of information being provided to passengers. FCC failed to maintain control of the situation resulting in many passengers opening doors and detraining. Due to the disabling of a safety system on board the train, the driver was unaware that doors were still open with passengers outside of the train when he conducted a pull test of the train. A number of doors were still open when the train eventually travelled to Kentish Town and then again went it travelled onwards to Cricklewood sidings.
